Fall Home Maintenance Reminders

As the weather turns chilly, here are some reminders to help keep your home warm and cozy before Winter weather sets in.

- Check the weather stripping around all doors and windows. Make repairs and updates as needed.
 When the Winter wind blows, you will be glad you did. Not only will you be warmer, but you will also be saving on energy costs.
- If you use window air conditioners during the summer, it is best to remove and store them during the Winter. No matter how well you cover them, drafts and heat loss will still occur throughout the Winter.
- When was the last time your
 Heating System was serviced? The
 service call for "no heat" will be
 much more expensive than a yearly
 service contract, which includes a
 tune-up of your system.

- One of the most common oversights in a home is blocking and obstructing heat supply vents. Relocate furniture or storage that will reduce the circulation of warm air within the room. Remember to check the air filter on your heating system monthly and change it as needed.
- Take a walk around the outside of your home and look for any openings around service lines, pipes, vents, and the roof line. Seal as needed because you are not the only one who will be looking for a warm place to spend the Winter. Field mice, squirrels, and other critters only need a small opening to get in.
- All garden hoses should be removed from the spigots to prevent freeze damage. Even if you have a "frost-free" hose bib, it is best to turn the water off on the interior of the house and drain the water line to the outside.

Carter Work Project Rural Rally

Habitat ChesCo will participate in Habitat for Humanity International's first-ever Rural Rally this fall. This rally is a new component of the Jimmy & Rosalynn Carter Work Project and highlights the need for housing that is affordable in rural America.

The Carter Work Project is Habitat's flagship build, honoring the profound impact of President and Mrs. Carter on Habitat's mission worldwide. This year, thousands of volunteers will gather in Austin, Texas, during the last week of October to build 25 homes on the city's east side. The Rural Rally, on Thursday, October 30th, will support home builds and rehabs in more than 60 rural communities across at least 20 states and all regions of the U.S.
