

What time should students arrive?

Students should arrive between 8:30am and 8:45 am on Saturday March 2nd with their dream homes and a print out of their 100 word minimum paragraph sharing the inspiration for their design. Students will be assigned a spot on a table to setup their homes and will need to be standing next to them at 9:00am when the competition starts. There will be three rounds of judging and the event will conclude at approximately 12:30pm.

Where is the event being held?

The competition will be at the Church Farm School in Exton, PA. The event will be in the "Founders Pavilion". A map of the school will be attached in an email sent to all participant 1 week before the event. There will be signs and attendants helping with drop off and parking. Will there be refreshments available?

We will have a few light refreshment for purchase such as water and chips.

What other fun things are happening?

What is the timeline for the day of the event?

- 8:30 AM: Contestants arrive
- 9:05 AM: Opening remarks
- 9:10 AM: First Round of judging begins
- 10:10 AM: First Round ends
- 10:55 AM: Final round begins
- 11:55 AM: Final round ends
- 12:20 PM: Awards Ceremony
- 12:30 PM: Contest over

Can we drop off the house the night before?

Yes! If it is helpful to drop off your dream home the night before, the Habitat staff will be at the Church Farm School between 5pm and 6pm. You are welcome to stop by and setup your house the night before to avoid coming early the next morning.

Is there anything to know about check-in?

To make check-in as smooth as possible, if contestants are working in groups of two, they can only register once the dream home is present. For example, if student A arrives before student B, but student B has the model, student A will have to wait for their partner before they can register. We are making this a requirement to make sure we point all of the students in the right direction. The judging
